Now What!!

Here we are—the day after Christmas. It's time for the decorations to come down, those beautiful, bright, festive colors that light up the season disappear and we are faced with: Now What!!

We've spent 4 Sundays preparing for the birth of Jesus and focusing on Hope and Love and Joy and Peace. You could say we have been basking in the Hope, Love, Joy, and Peace that the Messiah brings.

After the birth of Jesus, Joseph and Mary had at least 40 days to perform all things according to the law of the Lord which would have included the circumcision, Mary's time of purification, the presentation of Jesus at the temple, and the arrival of the Wise Men. Some scholars think it might have been up to 2 years before the Wise Men arrived.

We remember that before Jesus' birth, Mary made the trip to see Elizabeth who was pregnant with John, which was itself a miracle in her old age. Elizabeth validated that Mary was to be the mother of the Lord. At Jesus' birth, the shepherds were drawn into the picture and they validated that this was the Christ child, and then the Wise Men, the Magi came and presented "royal" gifts. When Jesus was presented at the temple two people, Simeon and Anna were yet others that validated that this was the Messiah. I'll call them their support group!! The group of those "in the know" had gotten bigger. I think Joseph and Mary needed those "others" to remind them that this was the Christ child.

In our scripture reading, after the Wise Men left, Joseph was told in a dream to take Mary & Jesus and flee to Egypt, we heard about the killing of the children, and the return from Egypt. Well, all the good festive feelings and our preparation times and looking forward to the Christ's birth and the excitement and celebration—what happened????

This is the Messiah who brings hope, love, joy and peace. It feels like the bottom fell out of things. In a way, maybe it feels like when we take all those decorations down and are left with the bareness, the emptiness and the let down.

We ask ourselves: Now What? Is it over? Is that all there is? Or is it a new beginning?

It is interesting to note that Joseph was told to flee to Egypt which was known as slavery, now it was going to be their protection, their sanctuary.

We read on in Matthew: When King Herod died, an angel appeared in a dream to Joseph saying that they were free to return to Israel. When Joseph heard that Herod's son was now ruler he was afraid to take his family and in another dream he was told to go to Galilee and they went to the town of Nazareth.

What a journey! Joseph and Mary were exercised in hearing the angelic messages and instructions of God. As we say, this wasn't their first rodeo. They had experienced some miraculous things God had told them. It was an anchoring in a faith in what God says He will do, He is able to bring it about. This is a trust worthy God; especially in spite of the darkness of the world.

As we've been preparing for the birth of Christ, Christ has been at work preparing a birth in you. How do I know that? Because that's what Jesus does. With that I have to ask: Do you know what He's been preparing to birth in you? Most times I don't have a clue. Most times I don't think He's birthing anything!

I'd like to share a song I wrote way back in 1992—
God our Father, sent His only son.
Conceived by the Spirit, God's will to be done
Mary a virgin, was the vessel He used
A common maid servant just like me and you
Now in this hour His search still goes on
