It's About Us.

At the recent table talk with the Bishop members of several other churches voiced complaints about the pastors they have been assigned in recent years. These individuals complained that pastors were not more eloquent, didn't reach young people, cost too much money and that if the current trend did not change, they saw their churches failing. None of our members voiced these concerns, although several members and I discussed what we heard following the table talk. What I heard supported the lessons I think we have learned as a congregation over the last 10 years.

Lesson One: It is all about the attitude and complaining never solves the problem. At Aldersgate we work together to get the work done, we don't expect someone else to do the work, we understand it's up to us to solve our problems.

Lesson Two: If we expect the pastor to bring in new members or young people the church will probably die. It is the responsibility of every member of the congregations to tell everyone we know in the community about our Risen Savior and the family at Aldersgate.

NEEDED HELP:

At our charge conference on December 29th, 2019, Aldersgate added 3 new positions to help with the workload. The new positions will be identified as Assistant Lay Leaders and will help the Pastor, Lay Leader and our church family with a variety of projects over the coming year. For example, Peggy Ryan ram-rodged the recent Wednesday Night dinner with Bishop Oliveto and the Mountain Sky Conference Cabinet.
