

T Mission Opportunities


Starting this month, the Aldersgate United Methodist Church will be adopting a Mission of the Month. Each month you will read and hear about the mission that we have adopted. For the month of February is two-fold ... Human Relations Day and Intermountain Ministries.

Human Relations Day is one of the six special offerings of our denomination. It recognizes the work of the Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr., the civil rights leader who championed the cause of freedom and dignity for all of God's Children. Offerings to this mission provide the following: 50% of the funds received support community developer programs that strive to build, maintain, promote and strengthen racial-ethnic minority congregations through local UMC congregations.

33% of the funds received support The United Methodist Voluntary Services (UMVS) that serves as a resource to congregations, volunteer-based groups, and programs that challenge unjust political, social, and economic systems which threaten the livelihoods of people.

10% of the funds received support rehabilitation programs. These programs work to strengthen youth empowerment programs that provide positive avenues for youth participation in their communities through the churches, mentoring programs, and boys/girls clubs.

In February you will hear more about this mission. Our other mission is Intermountain Ministries. Coin canisters have been placed throughout the congregation to receive your donation for a ministry started by the Methodists here in Montana. Services, based out of Helena, provide mental health and educational services to effectively meet the di-

Covid Sucks

Covid sucks. That's pretty blunt, but also very accurate. It has caused our world, our community and even Aldersgate enormous, short- and long-term issues. On the short-term, last week Pastor Seth tested positive and couldn't bring the message on Sunday. Members who had contact with the Pastor immediately prior to his positive test took cover and quarantined or wore masks until they tested negative.

On the long-term basis, attendance on Sunday is down approximately 30% from the pre-Covid Sunday attendance. Along with that giving is also down approximately 30%, which puts the members and committees charged with handling finances in a tough spot. We really cannot operate and maintain services with a 30% decrease in giving.

Fortunately in the short term we have a match gift in process, so that if we raise \$10,000 as a special offering, we will receive an additional \$10,000 matching gift. If you haven't contributed to the Match fund yet please do so, remembering that the Match gift must be in addition to your tithe. As of January 23 rd, 2023 we had reached approximately 75% of our matching gift goal. If you haven't contributed yet, or want to contribute more, just turn in a check with the word "Match" on the memo line. Thank you.



Bruce, Heather, and Joel all spent extra time with our audio and visual ministry to make sure our worship experience didn't skip a beat. Chuck and Jill took on extra responsibility during worship; and I apologize for those who I am missing who cleaned surfaces that I touched, handed out masks, and took on an extra role during my absence. And thank you for your texts, letters, and Facebook messages asking how I was doing.

As a church community, we have learned so much with the start of this Pandemic. We learned that we cannot rely on one person. Each of us plays a vital role when someone quarantines, when someone gets sick, when someone goes down and it means "next person up." We learned to rely on technology more than we did before. We learned to trust science. Masks work, and in my case, so did the vaccine. And we learned to trust. I trusted in the people of this congregation. I trusted in science every time I took a COVID test. I trusted in God that I would get through this. And I trusted in you. As a congregation, you wore the masks, used the hand sanitizer, and relied on our on-line services if you wanted to stay home. Thank you for weathering what is now "The New Normal."
